Please note the orientation session is to familiarize individuals and organizations with the LiveMeeting methods and the overall NMT approach. The Live Meeting software has improved with significant changes in audio and video potentials. This orientation session will also provide an overview and rationale for the assessment elements that will help create the clinical abstracts used throughout the series. ***Enrollment and participation in this series does qualify as Cases towards both individual and institutional certification (see the ChildTrauma Academy website for more details about certification).***

This is an ongoing clinical case conference series offered by the CTA. This teaching model has been useful for helping clinicians and front-line staff better understand the neurodevelopmental principles involved in many of the primary symptoms as well as strengths in the children they serve. This practical teaching model provides an opportunity for ongoing capacity building within an institution or for individuals.

We recommend our series as a complement to any more intensive training/program development projects that our partners have with the CTA. However, individual and institutional participation does not require any other program development activities or projects with the CTA and can serve as a good introduction to viewing maltreated and traumatized children through the "lens" of neurodevelopment.

Fees for the Clinical Teaching Series

All those interested in participating in attending either or both of these series must purchase a "Pass". Once purchased, participating professionals will receive invitations via email to each of the calls which will include a phone number to call and unique code to use to gain entry to the session. All sessions (Winter and/or Spring Series) must be purchased at once. No refunds or make-up sessions will be conducted for those participants who do not participate in any particular sessions.

The 2009 Winter Pass for organizations, with up to 25 participants per "connection", is a flat fee of \$1800. USD. (15 hours of clinical consultation and training). The 2009 Winter Pass for individual professionals not enrolling as part of an organization's subscription is \$650. USD for all 10 sessions (15 hours of clinical consultation and training).

The 2009 Spring Pass for organizations, with up to 25 participants per "connection", is a flat fee of \$1800. USD. (15 hours of clinical consultation and training). The 2009 Spring Pass for individual professionals not enrolling as part of an organization's subscription is \$650. USD for all 10 sessions (15 hours of clinical consultation and training).

All participants will receive instructions regarding software and teleconferencing once your subscription form is received.
